



cancelled




Equine welfare will become increasingly concerning regarding biosecurity with the predicted migration of vectors north, as well as spikes in temperature causing heatstroke and other risks



The UK Government is already proposing air conditioning requirements for travel in temperatures warmer than 30°C.

With Met Office predicting 40°C now 10x more likely.

Impacts within horse racing



Businesses across the industry produce a range of general waste from plastics to paper, food waste and large items.

Waste presents a reputational, operational and financial risk to the industry



There is an estimated 160 miles of white plastic running rail in use across racecourses alone. This has a lifetime of around 15 years, and often cannot be recycled.

Similarly, padded hurdles are sent to landfill or incinerated.



Horses produce on average 50 pounds of manure each day. The storage and removal of equine waste materials presents operational and financial challenges for racecourses, yards and studs.


Reputation management & social responsibility


